D Major

Index finger: 2nd fret, 3rd string (G)

Middle finger: 2nd fret, 1st string (E)

Ring finger: 3rd fret, 2nd string (B)

Strum from the 4th string down.

Em (E Minor)

Index finger: 2nd fret, 5th string (A)

Strum all six strings.

C Major

Index finger: 1st fret, 2nd string (B)

Middle finger: 2nd fret, 4th string (D)

Ring finger: 3rd fret, 5th string (A)

Strum from the 5th string down.

Am (A Minor)

Index finger: 1st fret, 2nd string (B)

Middle finger: 2nd fret, 4th string (D)

Ring finger: 2nd fret, 3rd string (G)

Strum from the 5th string down.

Capo Placement (Optional)

Many guitarists choose to place a capo on the 2nd fret to match Chris Young's vocal range. If you do this, the chord shapes remain the same, but the actual key becomes A major. This can help you match the original recording more closely.

Strumming Pattern

The strumming pattern for "The Man I Want to Be" is designed to provide a steady, country inspired rhythm. A simple yet effective pattern you can use throughout the song is:

1. Downstroke on the 1st beat
2. Downstroke on the & of 1
3. Upstroke on the 2nd beat
4. Downstroke on the 3rd beat
5. Downstroke on the & of 3
6. Upstroke on the 4th beat

Feel free to add subtle variations in the bridge or pre chorus to keep the arrangement dynamic.

Fingerstyle Option
