Tips for Customizing Mad Minute Worksheets

- Intermediate Level: 2–12 tables with a mix of single and double-digit products.
- Advanced Level: 2–18 tables, include 3-digit multiplications.

2. Incorporate Word Problems

To make the worksheet more engaging, replace some pure multiplication problems with short word problems that require students to identify the relevant product. For example: “If a book costs \$15 and you buy 9 books, how much do you spend?”

3. Use Color Coding
