Sample Word Problems and Step by Step Solutions

1. Addition Word Problem

Emma had 27 stickers. She received 18 more stickers from her friend. How many stickers does Emma have now?

Solution:

4. Calculation: $53 - 19 = 34$.
5. Check: $53 - 10 = 43$; $43 - 9 = 34$. Correct.
6. Answer: 34 books remain on the shelf.

3. Mixed Operations Word Problem

During recess, Lily had 12 marbles. She gave 5 to her friend and then found 9 more on the playground. How many marbles does Lily have now?

Solution:

1. Read: Starts with 12, gives away 5, finds 9.
2. Question: Final count.
3. Operations: Subtraction then addition.
4. Step 1: $12 - 5 = 7$.
5. Step 2: $7 + 9 = 16$.
6. Check: $12 - 5 = 7$; $7 + 9 = 16$. Correct.
7. Answer: Lily has 16 marbles.

4. Fraction Word Problem

A pizza is divided into 4 equal slices. Sarah ate 2 slices. What fraction of the pizza is left?

Solution:

1. Read: 4 slices total, Sarah ate 2.
2. Question: Fraction left.
3. Operation: Subtraction of fractions.
4. Step 1: $4 - 2 = 2$ slices left.
5. Step 2: 2 out of 4 = $\frac{2}{4}$.
6. Reduce: $\frac{2}{4} = \frac{1}{2}$.
7. Answer: Half of the pizza is left.

5. Measurement Word Problem

A ribbon is 30 inches long. If you cut a piece that is 8 inches, how many inches of ribbon remain?

Solution:

1. Read: 30 inches total, cut 8 inches.
2. Question: Remaining length.
3. Operation: Subtraction.
4. Calculation: $30 - 8 = 22$ inches.
5. Check: $30 - 5 = 25$; $25 - 3 = 22$. Correct.
6. Answer: 22 inches of ribbon remain.

Common Mistakes and How to Address Them

Even diligent students can stumble when tackling word problems. Recognizing and correcting typical errors helps them become more confident problem solvers.

Misreading the Problem

Students often overlook keywords such as “more,” “fewer,” or “difference.” Encourage them to underline or highlight these words before solving.

Skiping Steps

In multi step problems, students might rush to the answer without verifying each intermediate step. Teach the habit of writing every step and checking the logic.

Using the Wrong Operation

Choosing addition instead of subtraction (or vice versa) leads to incorrect answers. Reinforce the connection between the question’s wording and the required operation.

Ignoring Units

When measurement or money appears, students may forget to keep track of units (inches, dollars). Modeling proper notation and reviewing units regularly can prevent this.
