Micro architecture is a popular trend. Build a 7x7 tiny house with a sloped roof, a single room, and a small storage area. Use stairs for a lofted bed, and incorporate a tiny kitchen with a furnace and crafting table. Keep the exterior simple with wood and stone blocks.

Functional Simple Builds

Storage Shed

Organized storage is essential for long term survival. Construct a 6x6 shed with a stone foundation, wooden walls, and a sloped roof. Inside, place chests arranged by category (tools, food, building blocks). Add a workbench and a furnace for quick crafting.

Furnace House
